> The City is inhabited by scattered human and transhuman tribes as well as hostile cyborgs known as Silicon Creatures. The Net Terminal Genes appear to be the key to halting the unhindered, chaotic expansion of the Megastructure, as well as a way of stopping the murderous horde known as the Safeguard from destroying all humanity.

> On forums and image boards, scrambled text began being associated with Zalgo with phrases like "he comes" and "he waits behind the wall."

> The text is an abuse of a Unicode feature that enables the user to combine multiple diacritical characters into horizontal and vertical lines often resulting in text glitching over its designated boxes.

> A text box is a graphical control element intended to enable the user to input text information to be used by the program. Non-editable text boxes can serve the purpose of simply displaying text.

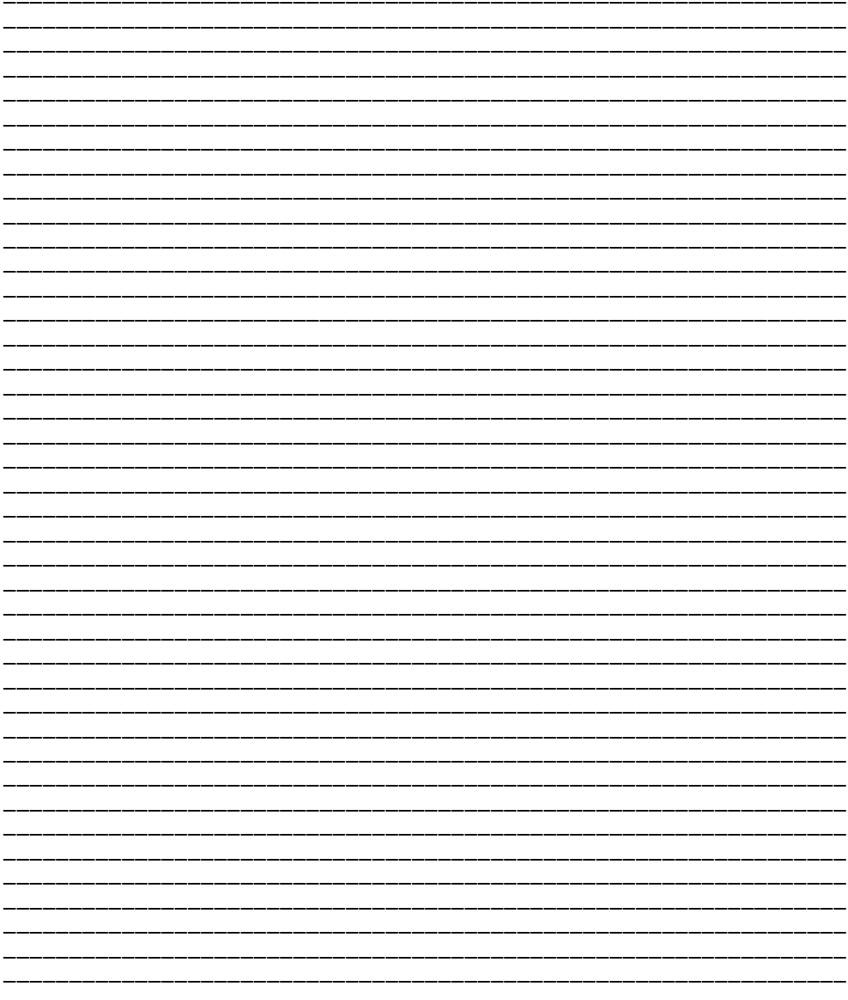
